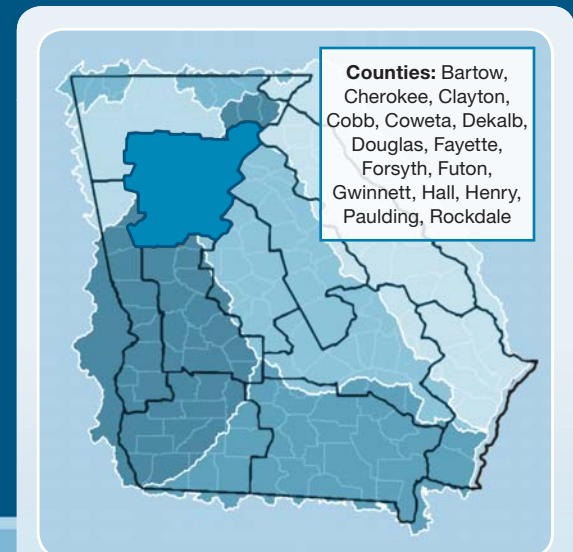


METRO WATER DISTRICT

BACKGROUND

The Metropolitan North Georgia Water Planning District (Metro Water District) was created by the Georgia General Assembly in 2001 to establish policy, create plans and promote intergovernmental coordination of all water issues in the District from a regional prospective. The mission of the Metro Water District is to develop comprehensive regional water resource plans that protect water quality and public water supplies in and downstream of the region, to protect the recreational values of the waters in and downstream of the region and to minimize potential adverse impacts of development on waters in and downstream of the region.



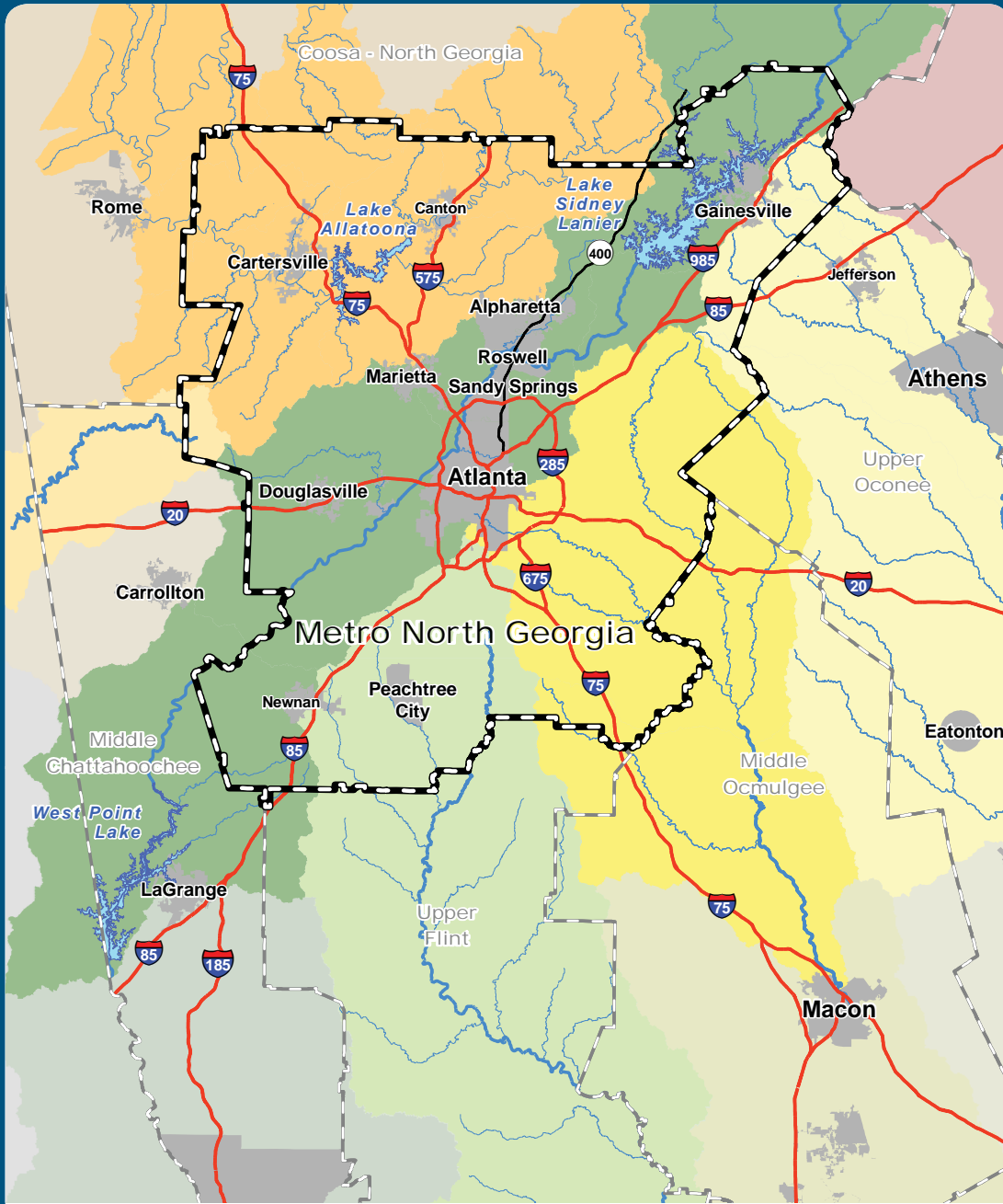

KEY WATER RESOURCE ISSUES BEING ADDRESSED BY THE METRO WATER DISTRICT

1. The Water Supply and Water Conservation Management Plan includes recommendations for an aggressive water demand/conservation program and calls for the reallocation of Lakes Lanier and Allatoona for water supply and the construction of six new reservoirs.
2. The Wastewater Management Plan outlines a long-term implementation schedule for public wastewater treatment. It also provides for comprehensive wastewater planning to establish future sewer service areas and calls for more intensive management of privately owned septic systems.
3. The Watershed Management Plan provides a comprehensive suite of local management measures intended to foster watershed protection, effective stormwater management, water quality improvement and the implementation of green infrastructure practices.

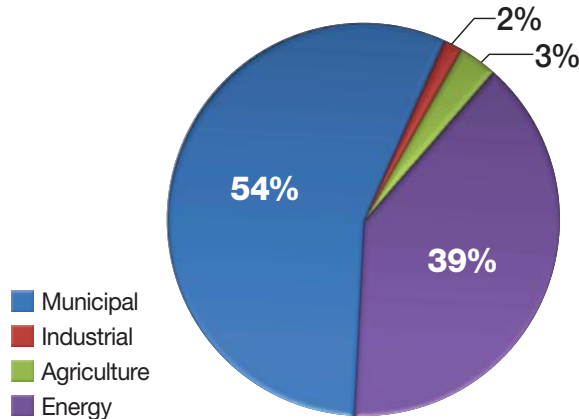
